Donations are also accepted at My Quilting Loft in Troutdale. Fortunately, we have been mostly keeping up with the regular numbers of donations, even with the fire survivor quilt donations. We can always use more help with quilting Charity quilts!
- Temperature quilt challenge. The information is on the Facebook page for now.
- Deb- Membership. There were several comments/questions in the membership renewals.
 - Membership drive with incentives for bringing in new members? This is something we will look at when we can meet in persona again.
 - Small group in person meetings. Deb will email this person about small group meetings. At this time we are following health protocols and not meeting in person-even for small groups.
 - Can we add people for Zoom meetings? In January, 2021, we will start adding people to our Zoom Recording Meetings. This will be through a lottery. Look for more information in the December Newsletter. The people who are at the Zoom Record Meetings will be able to ask the presenter questions. Everybody will be introduced after the speaker is done BUT everyone does not need to speak. We are working on using the chat option for questions during the Recording Meeting with presenters.

There is one group that may open using Zoom for just the Covid time (and will fold when we are able to meet in person again). There are currently 5 small groups meeting on Zoom and 1 plus Open Sew are open to more members. Open Sew is currently a Zoom once a month and always open! Wendy will mention **Zoomertunities** at the next Recording Meeting.
