This is an oldie, but goodie. You will be surprised at how quickly the block comes together, and looks like alot more work than it is. We are starting to get a little color popping out as a spring teaser, so I was thinking we could hurry spring up a little and make some bright and cheery birds this month. This month we get to practice our lining up seams and using small pieces.. Just think how cute these little birds will look in bright spring colors! White background, but your choice of bright spring color for the bird. No large prints please.

Please be sure your white fabric is indeed white. If you aren't sure, hold it up against a piece of white paper to compare.

What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild provides a specific free pattern as a challenge for interested guild members to make. Most blocks have a skill to learn or practice to keep our skills sharp. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. Normally one raffle ticket is given for each block turned in, and you can make more than one block for more chances to win! Watch for specials some months where you have a chance to get more tickets to win! A drawing is done for those who turned in blocks and the winner gets all the blocks! Sometimes when there is a large amount of blocks submitted, there may be more than one winner!

Give it a try- It is fun to finish a quick project, and you may just WIN the blocks!

She strongly recommends labeling every quilt!

SORAPPY QUILIPING




Most of you who have picked up a kit for a quilt top from us know that it was made from donated pieces of fabric. Sometimes it comes as strips, blocks, fat quarters, or yardage pieces with chunks removed. With some time and effort, these random pieces are pressed, cut, and bundled into a pack that usually makes a 40"x60" quilt for a child or an adult. Sometimes it is a bundle of similar fabric where you can make up your own design. Sometimes it is UFO that was abandoned in the past and just needs a fresh start.

HOORAY FOR RAYESS

Last month, we were blessed with a huge donation of scrappy blocks that were pieced by Raye B..... the *Queen of the Scrap Pile*!

The last time she gifted us a huge pile, we made 17 quilts from her blocks!!

I immediately dove into the pile and sewed a top to take to show other quilters. The members who attended the National Sew Day were able to also grab enough blocks to stitch a top for us. There soon will be many scrappy tops ready for you to quilt on your domestic machine. These are the perfect practice tops, because the eye of the quilt receiver is overwhelmed with all the fabric. (Little attention is drawn to those quilting stitches, the fabric is too interesting!) These are the perfect tops for a child who needs some distraction while resting and getting healthy. We will have "Raye Blocks" available for the next several months. Maybe she will inspire you to sew up a few blocks of your own, and use up your scraps. It's hard to stop, once you get started.









This year, we will continue to find ways to use our donated fabric to make needed items for


Fill a Stocking Fill a Heart.

Sewing room will be open from <u>6 am until 10 pm daily on Tuesday</u>, <u>Wednesday and Thursday</u>. Tables are arranged in 8 person pods, 7 total. We will have 4 ironing stations and 3 cutting mats on raised tables. You will have room at your sewing station for TV tray style individual ironing boards. There is room for many to put up portable design walls, if desired. Catered lunches will be served daily.
