

Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes

July 16, 2019

President Donna Taylor called the meeting to order promptly at 7:00 p.m. and drew two door prizes. As her final order of business as Vice President, Pat Curtis introduced the evening's speaker Debby Potter. Debby learned to hand sew from her grandmother at the age of six. She later taught herself machine sewing. She took lots of classes learning to get tactile and visual textures in her work. She works with fabrics, metals, buttons and beads, etc. Her best advice is to see the unordinary in the ordinary and to take risks. So she described sewing as three zones:

Comfort zone – where you are doing what you know and aren't learning anything.

Risk zone – where you are sewing outside of your comfort zone & you are learning something new Panic zone – where you are so far out of your comfort zone you don't learn anything new Debby will be teaching a class to make fabric cottages later in July.

After the speaker, Delleen got up to thank everyone for the whole bunch of charity quilts that came in, but said that there was a lot to still go out. She is also in need of domestic quilters for the charity quilts. She mentioned that this is a good place to learn a new skill. Contact her if interested. Delleen also shared an interesting tidbit about how sewers had their part in space history. Playtex girdle sewers were recruited to sew space suits. Show and Share was completed and the meeting adjourned at 8:34 p.m.


First Sunday Open Sew

Stitching Comfort Community Outreach

If you were at the last meeting, you heard me sharing about how we always seem to have more quilt tops than quilters to finish them. There were a few people who stepped up and took some, but I'm still looking for more help with domestic machine quilting. Please email me if you would be able to take on a project for us. I'd love to get more of you involved in that step of the process.

Because the guild began in the summer of 2015, the summer months seem to be a time where I look back and see how we are doing. We are really getting the fabric moving! So far this year there are 173 quilts delivered. Since 2015 there have been over 800 quilts donated by our members. The numbers break down like this:

Now I know this is a fluid number. It doesn't include aprons, pillowcases, and other items. Many of you are sewing bindings and piecing tops to turn in soon. But as you are sewing, it's nice to know how far we've come as an organization of community stitchers. Thank you to all of you who have contributed time, talent, and fabric.

Look for an email around mid-August containing retreat information (location, what to bring, etc.), as well as the fabric requirements and cutting instructions for the Mystery Quilt. 1. Get your registration forms in ASAP!!! Even if your quilt isn't finished yet, just take a photo of the top, fill out your form, and turn it in. **The deadline is August 20th!!!** (That's the deadline just for the form - NOT to have your quilt finished!) 2. Make cool items to donate for sale in our Boutique! There are three times and places to drop off your items: Aug. 13th, at the Guild meeting; Aug. 28th at First Baptist Church on Powell (across from the Post Office), between 11:00 am and 3:00 pm; and Aug. 31st, at Charlotte Toman's house. Call Charlotte to let her know you'll be coming - 503-679-9216.

3. Make a little quilt for our silent auction! Bring the quilt to the August or September meeting. Give it Debbie Johnsen or Tomme Fent.

4. Ask your friends, neighbors, and local businesses to buy an ad in our quilt show catalog! Ad sizes, formats, and prices are available on our website, under the Quilt Show tab.

5. Finish your quilt for the show (ha!).

6. Be ready to sign up at the August meeting to volunteer at the show. We'll need people to help set up and tear down, take money at the door, sell tickets for our raffle quilt, and act as Quilt Angels (wearing white gloves to show people the backs of quilts, and generally keep an eye on things on the show floor).
