Mt. Hood Quitt Guild Minutes July 14, 2020 VIRTUAL MEETING— Tips and Treasures

President Wendy Sternberg greeted members with a rundown of the video guild meeting which will include several videos including member Arden Shelton's talk on bindings and a collection of some personal sewing spaces put together by Becky Caputo and links to Berkeley Museum Show of Rosie Lee Thompkins Show and Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show

She also talked about our online election which will be in a separate email. Also membership renewal will be online or by postal mail. And she talked about the challenge she posted on our Facebook group to post pictures of quilts around our homes. Numerous members have already joined in the challenge.

Wendy mentioned that in the video tonight Board Members would be giving tips and showing personal treasures. Wendy's tip was a demonstration of how to do corners of bindings and her treasure is a doll quilt made by her Nana. She then drew the monthly Birthday drawing. This month's winner is Kim Simmons.

Membership Committee Chair Debbie O'Donnell was happy to see that many members had already renewed and we even had a one new member. Debbie gave a description of the process to do online renewal & payment or by printing off the renewal page and sending a check in the mail. Debbie did not have a tip ready but she showed an example of a quilt that she did using Steam-a-seam2. When the instructions say to press using a lot of steam it is best done just as indicated as she didn't and hers started to come undone as she was working with it.

Treasurer Laura Rom had a request of everyone. She realized that most people probably licked their envelopes when sealing them and now she was opening them and she felt uncomfortable in this age of the virus. She asked that when mailing in your membership renewal if you weren't using a self-sealing envelope or tape that you use a sponge to wet the adhesive and mark your envelope with SWAS- sealed with a sponge. Laura's treasure is about 100 2.5" squares in pale pink and pale cream corset fabric given to her by her sisterin-law. She is looking for ideas on how to use them. Since she didn't have a tip she showed her second treasure of a small pig that stays in her sewing room.

Retreat Coordinator Barbara Belgrave talked about the virtual retreat and mentioned that all members who paid a deposit for the regular retreat should have already received your refund. If not, they should contact her or Laura. The newsletter has all the details of the upcoming virtual retreat on October 1-4. Members need to make sure their membership has been renewed prior to signing up for the retreat. There will be a detailed email sent out about the middle of September and retreaters will need to pick up supply packets on September 26 at the church. There will also be a test to make sure everyone can connect successfully to Zoom. Barbara's tip is to make sure that you close your rotary cutter. A sewing group friend didn't do this and the cutter fell off the table and cut her foot. Her treasure is a 'pink' mouse & cheese pin cushion from a prior retreat that she put onto a large mouse trap.

Susan Ainsworth Smith is letting everyone know that the Stash Shuffle is on hold for now. Any monies paid in for tables will be refunded. Her treasure is macaroni soup can made many years ago by her daughter Camille and given to Sue's dad. Since he died in 2012, it now sits on Sue's desk.

Lori Oathes, Block of the Month Coordinator, revealed the second part of last month's two part project. This month expands on skills we have previously acquired. It is a quilted gift bag. The pattern will be posted on the web site. Her tip is to "measure twice, and cut once" as she didn't do that on this project and then needed to piece fabric together to finish her bag. And she asks that members post their projects on Facebook and share. Her treasure is a neck pillow made by a friend. This treasure has been especially important to her now as she works from home and it helps support her back. Lori also reminded everyone to renew their membership so the guild will have funds to bring in nationally known speakers.

Delleen Kompkoff, Community Outreach, thanked all helpers who assisted in getting tops, kits, etc. delivered out to quilters to get worked on during the pandemic. Over 50 quilt tops have been passed on to others to finish. She also noted that she would be at the Guild fabric sale July 22nd to collect food bags, masks, and any other donations. She also made a point to say that Human Solutions and other schools and agencies are looking for mask donations. Contact Susan Ainsworth Smith about dropping off donated masks. She also was reminded recently by Susan Schmidt from Quilts Beyond Borders that the Navaho Nation will be having a huge drive in September. Quilts Beyond Borders has an annual Holiday Delivery that distributes quilts to daycare centers, rest homes, and elders. Quilts can be any size and done for kids or adults, but need to be finished and bound. Delleen also spoke about Quilts Beyond Borders having a monthly Fat Quarter Challenge. Anyone who donates quilts made from fat quarters gets their name entered into a drawing for a \$25 coupon. Last year, Delleen used her winnings to buy rotary blades and a charm pack.

Another opportunity. Liz Sheeley is sewing medical gowns for staff of Parkview Christian Retirement Center. They allow us to use their facility for monthly Open Sew without any fee. They are looking for about 15 gowns. There is a YouTube video and pattern available at this link: https://www.uhsinc.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/DIY-Medical-Gown-Pattern.pdf. It is a very simple pattern that takes about 30-40 minutes once you understand the lesson.

Delleen then moved on to voting for our Board Members. Two wonderful volunteers have stepped forward. Dottie Miller and Linda Gaudette-Sigel have volunteered for the Vice-President and Secretary, respectively. They have offered their skills to help plan guild meeting and their quilting knowledge. An email was to follow soon. Voting is encouraged as it is a way to hear from members and find out what it is that you think. Delleen's tip is to use a charm pack to make quick and easy 4 patches. Her treasure is several partially finished flannel quilts given to her. With seam allowances not accurate, her first thought was to beat it into submission but she sliced and diced it instead. The smaller, more manageable pieces got some added Minky and it ended up being one of the softest quilts Delleen has seen in a long time. Delleen tip is all about deconstructing and reconstructing items given to us that someone tried but didn't work. She said this provides a good learning opportunity.

Becky Caputo has been organizing the fabric sale for the Guild in her back yard on July 22nd. It is also a drop off and pick up point for all the things that are normally along the back tables at our guild meetings. And she talked about the video she put together of members sewing areas. If other members are interested in submitting photos or videos of their sewing areas, please submit them to Becky to be included in future videos. Her tip is to always use more pins that what you think is necessary. Pins are easier to take out than seams. Her treasure is a pin cushion bathtub made for her by a co-worker that she thought didn't like her.

As our speaker, Arden Shelton gave an informative demonstration on cutting and sewing binding.

Prior to doing the Show and Share, Staci Wendland gave her tips and treasures. Her tip is, if you are going to start anything, read all the instructions first. In looking for a special treasure that someone made for her, she realized that her sewing room is her treasure since her husband changed everything about the room, shelving, flooring, etc. Then she thanked everyone for submitting photos for Show and Share. Staci also highly recommended checking out our Facebook group for the Guild as there are many photos shared there. She then showed pictures of the many quilts members have finished.

Wendy signed off the meeting by asking all members to stay in touch and share any ideas they have.




