AUGUST 2022 BLOCK OF THE MONTH - POPSICLES

The pattern is posted on the Guild website in the Members Only section under the Project Of the Month. One block = 1 ticket for the drawing. Let's make it a sweet month with a parade of popsicles!

What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild has a Block Of the Month challenge where a specific free pattern is designated for interested guild members to make. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a raffle. The blocks are displayed with the hopes of inspiring all members. One ticket is given for each block turned in.

The blocks are then raffled off and the inner wins all the blocks!

 Bring items for the **Boutique**. Janet and Raye Ann have given out ideas, patterns, and kits to help you. But we know there are many other possibilities that you can make. They are all welcome. We greatly appreciate the creative items some of you have already donated!

2. Bring items for the **Raffle Baskets**. The basket themes selected are as follows:

Fall/Harvest; Game; Kitchen; Quilters; Garden and Wine and Dine.

Raffle baskets should be pretty and have a nice assortment of items to make everyone want to win one or two. These items don't all have to be quilting/sewing related but should make the baskets desirable. The committee will add fabric, patterns, thread, etc. when assembling the baskets.

If you have an extra medium or medium-large basket to donate, we could use that also. Thank you.

3. Bring in your Quilt **Entry forms**. The sooner you get your forms entered, the better idea we will have to plan. Once we have a feeling for the size and number of quilts you are entering, we may be able to ask for more.

At the August, September, and October meetings:

1. Buy Raffle Quilt tickets.

That is great but what we would really like you to do is to take an envelope of 12 tickets to sell to your friends and family. There is a picture on the website that you can download to your phone. Or --- Take a selfie with it!!! It is 80" X 80" so can be used on a queen size bed.

2. Take a stack of **Bookmarks** to give to your friends. Also think of other places you could post them. Many stores have community bulletin boards, or possibly your church.

At the September and October meetings:

We will have sign up sheets for all the jobs that are needed to have a successful show. Some are very active, like the hanging of the quilts, but there are other jobs than you can sit and take in money and some that can be a combination. So be thinking of what you would like to do. Volunteers do get free entry to the show.

Quilt Entry Information and Instructions for the 2022 MHQG Quilt Show

Click here to print a Quilt Entry Form

—Use this if you plan to enter other shows where you will need to have a sleeve large enough to fit the bars.

Cut fabric 9" wide and as long as needed for the width of the quilt. Press under the short ends ½ inch twice, pressing each time and sewing the inside fold. Fold wrong sides together, lengthwise and sew together with a ½ inch seam. Finished sleeve will be 4" wide. Using the longest machine stitch possible, add a basting stitch ½ " from the folded edge. Then roll the basted stitch to the top center of the sleeve so the basted stitch is situated over the other seam, which will be situated against the quilt back. Pin the quilt sleeve to the quilt back 1/2 inch below the top of the quilt. Press seam to one side. The width should allow the sleeve to be positioned about ½ inch from each edge. Stitch sleeve securely in place. Whip-stitch the ends to the back of the quilt, which assures that the hanging device is inserted into the sleeve properly. It helps to take an extra stitch every 4-5 stitches so the sleeve won't become loosened from the quilt. Be sure that the stiches do not go through to the front of the quilt. Once the sleeve has been securely stitched to the quilt back remove the basting stitch from the sleeve. This tuck allows room for the hanging device to be inserted without creating tension on the front of the quilt.

—If you are only going to hang your quilt in the Mt. Hood Guild Show or in your home, you may use a 5" wide piece of fabric which will make a 2" sleeve because our equipment is different in that the bar is thinner.


Stitching Comfort Community Outreach






