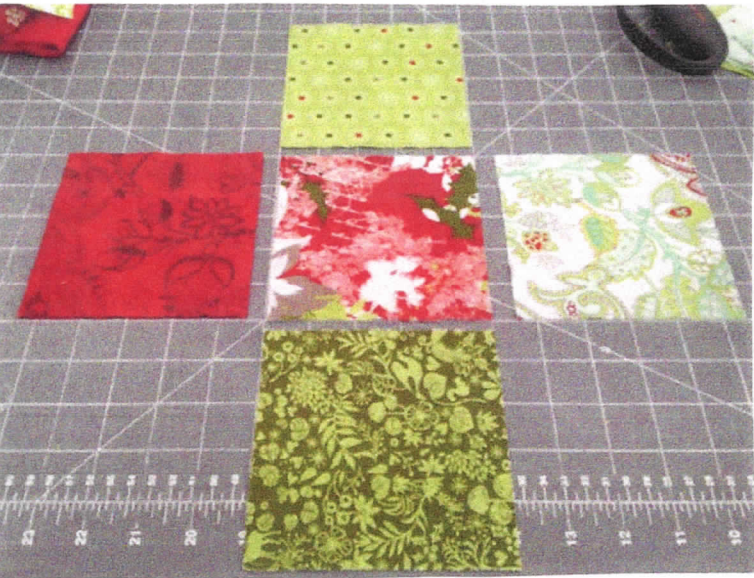


Coasters

- Select five 5" squares.
- Fold four in half and place on the middle square with the fold towards the center of the square and all the raw edges facing out. Pin at each corner.



- When all 4 squares are folded and pinned, lift up the first fold and tuck in the fourth fold, like when closing a lid of a box.



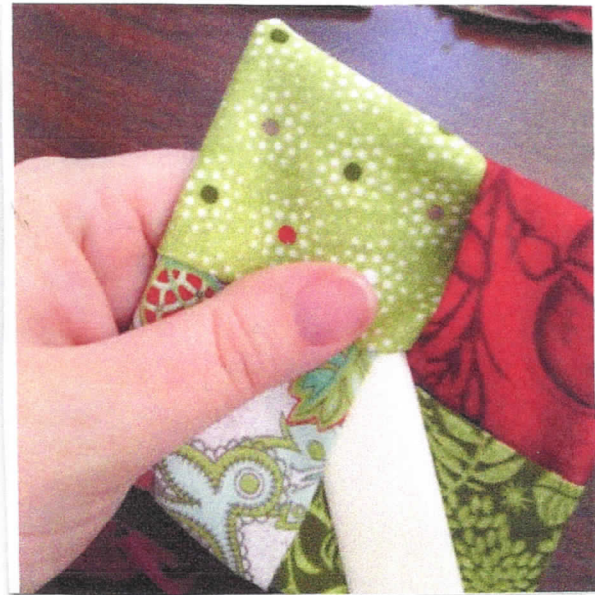
- I pin all four sides just to make sure nothing slips as I sew. Sew all around the square, not need to leave an opening for turning.



- Trim the corners and threads.



- Open the center folds and turn inside out. You have five layers of fabric.



- Top stitching is optional.



Coasters #2

- Select five 5" squares
- Take out one of the squares that you will be using for bottom piece with other four iron to make a triangle.
- Take one ironed triangle and place on the raw edge of the bottom piece
- Repeat with the other three
- With the fourth triangle, lift up the last triangle side to bring the fabric towards the fabric that is showing (like closing a box lid)
- Pin all four side together
- Sew around all four sides with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Snip the corners. Turn inside out through the middle.
- Top stitch if desired.



Coasters #3

You will need the hexie half ruler

- Select seven 5" squares
- Fold your fabric in half and line the dotted lines on the bottom of the ruler up with the folded edge.
- Open it up. Lay the fabric you want for the bottom face up on the table.
- Fold and iron your remaining six charms in half.
- Lay the folded on the top
- Lay your next hexie on the next edge. You are going to do this on all six side of the ~~#1~~ bottom hexie.
- When you get to the fifth one you will need to lift the first one and lay it under. # 2
- The six one goes under the first one also. But it is on top of the fifth one.
- Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam all the way around.
- Trim
- Top stitch if desired.
