Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes

November 12, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm and President Donna Taylor drew some on-time door prizes. Donna also announced that a reporter from Gresham Outlook was present tonight to get the story on our Guild donating 1000 comfort quilts to surrounding community.

The Snow Policy was also reviewed by Donna. If there is ever a doubt whether the Board Meetings or Guild meetings will be held due to inclement weather, please see our Facebook page or we also follow Gresham Barlow School District. If evening activities are cancelled for Gresham Barlow, then our meetings or activities are also canceled.

Vice President Linda Shaull came up to explain the December Meeting/Holiday party process. Due to the fact that we will have several cakes to celebrate our 1000th donated Comfort Quilt, the theme for our party will be Savory & Salad. Also bring a gift of a Mug & a Mug Rug or something else sewing related. There will be an exchange table for each type of gift. We will also play Strip Poker again this year, so each member is asked to bring at least 30 strips (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF) to exchange during the game.

Linda then introduced the speaker for the evening; Carol Hattan. As a retired high school math teacher, Carol has gone on to become a certified instructor for Judy Niemeyer's quilting company, Quiltworx http://www.quiltworx.com/. Carol specializes in paper piecing using such techniques as smart corners and floating points. She is currently teaching at Cedar Ridge Quilts in Oregon City, Sharon's Attic Quilt Shop in Hillsboro and Just for Fun Quilting in Vancouver.

Donna mentioned that due to Heidi's closing for the evening on December 3rd, the December Board meeting will be held at Elmer's in Gresham at 7:00 p.m.

Delleen Kompkoff thanked all members who responded to her email requesting information on other organizations that people donate time. This information is helpful to the Outlook reporter to show that we are not just committed to our guild but to our whole community. The 1000th comfort quilt went to Pregnancy Resource Center. There got very emotional to know they were the recipient. The Baby Box has been cleaned out and replenished along with the Hawaiian Box and both are ready for members to check out. Orphan blocks sewn together by Shirley Wilson made great quilts. Also we have had lots of donations of batting which helps our funds go farther.

After a 10 minute break taken at 8:03 p.m., the birthday drawing was done.

Tomme Fent says she is working on a "How to" notebook for the next quilt show in 2021.

Pat Miles is organizing a Travel Quilting group. A meeting held on Sunday November 17th at the Gresham Library will help identify how this group will be made up and what activities it pursues.

Debbie Stoffer from Membership stated there were 107 members, 7 visitors and 4 renewals in attendance. Membership is also looking for new committee members.

Linda Wood got up to thank everyone for the cards, prayers and best wishes. She remains cheerful and optimistic as she enters the next phase of her treatment.

Lori Oathes explained that even though there was less participation in the 2019 UFO Challenge, it just means a better chance for participants to win. We had 19 participants and 61 projects completed. This challenge was a 50/50 fundraiser raising \$95 for the Guild. Winners were as follows: 1st place Jan Brown, 2nd place Susan Ainsworth Smith, 3rd place Eileen McCloskey and 4th place Suzi Grunau.

Show & Share had a lot of participants including some more quilting barn boards and small group projects.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:48 p.m.

Stitching Comfort community Outreach

I hope you all shared <u>the **Gresham Outlook**</u> <u>article</u> with a non-quilter to help explain what we've been up to the last few years. I think it helps people understand why we find joy in using fabric.

A few quilts that have been donated lately have been backed with fleece. I haven't tried that yet, but the ones I've seen are certainly soft. Depending on the sale price, it is a good way to eliminate both the batting and the backing in a quilt. If you have smaller pieces of fleece in your stash, you may want to slice it into scarves (8" or 9" by 60") for a donation to **Human Solutions.** When I did this,

I just rolled up the scarves and tied them with a ribbon.

Occasionally I get smaller pieces of fleece donated that don't seem to fit either purpose. Last month I was able to pass those smaller pieces on to another group to use in a unique project. There is a group in Happy Valley that uses 1" strips in Snuffle Mats for dogs at the Clackamas Animal Shelter. If you have random fleece scraps to pass on, I would be glad to take them just like your other fabric donations. The funny part of this story is how they shared the fleece bits too small for mats, that I could pass on to a contact who uses filler for dog beds. I'm continually amazed at the opportunities for recycling and repurposing the donations the guild receives.

I wish you all a Merry Christmas, enough time to finish all your projects, and a chance to help someone else. Enjoy everything this season has to offer you and your family. Thank you for the gifts of time you give to others.

Join our newest challenge! Each month we will be doing a new Block of the Month, which will allow quilters of all levels to learn or practice piecing skills, and maybe use some scraps. The blocks will then be raffled off to a lucky winner!

How it works: 1) Make the block following the requirements in the instructions.

- 2) Bring block to the MHQG meeting & turn in.
- 3) Each block gets one entry into drawing
- 4) A name is drawn & blocks are awarded to a winner!

NOTE: if there are a large amount of blocks, more than one winner will be drawn.

BOM January 2020 – Floating Winter Star block

This challenge provides practice handling bias edges, sewing 1/4" seams and flying geese.

Fabric choices: Think sparkling winter blues. The star will be blue with a white-on-white background. For the blue, please use true blues avoiding teal, turquoise or purple shades and prints with other bright colors-the colors should read as blue.

Makes one 12" Floating Star Block (12 1/2" unfinished) Background fabric: cut **4** - 4" x 4" squares and **4**- 4" x 5 1/2" rectangles Star: **1** - 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" square and **8** - 3" x 3" squares

Construction: See example pic below. Tips: light starch, and careful pressing helps avoid stretching bias edges.

1) Draw a light diagonal line corner to corner on wrong side of all 3" squares.

2) Lay down a $4 \ge 5 \frac{1}{2}$ background rectangle with long side nearest you, right side up. Place a 3" star square on bottom left corner- right sides together so line runs diagonal down from left to right. Stitch on the drawn line. Trim off the extra corner piece $\frac{1}{4}$ from the seam. Carefully press towards corner. Repeat with

another 3" square on lower right side of the rectangle- line should run diagonal down from right to left. Sew, trim & press. Now you have a star point rectangle. Repeat with remaining three background rectangles to complete all four sides of the star points.

3) Stitch two star point rectangles to opposite sides of the 5 1/2" square to make a center row. The V of the star point rectangles should point towards the 5 1/2" square after sewn. Try to avoid sewing through the point of the "V". Press towards the center square.

4) Stitch a background 4"x4" square to the short sides of the two remaining star point rectangles. This makes two more rows. Press toward the white squares.

5) Stitch all three rows together with the row with 5" square in the center, Line up seams- use pins if needed. Try to avoid sewing through points. Press towards center. Your block should be $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Do not square up.
