Remember, no food or beverages this year.



Block of the Month

DECEMBER - SPECIAL CALL FOR BLOCKS

At the last guild meeting I announced no BOM for December. **BUT** that was before I got a call about an **urgent** need for bereavement quilts for the Veteran's Hospital in Portland. Veterans are very near and dear to me, so I thought I would challenge our amazing guild members to help out with this need.


The American Legion Auxiliary and Quilts Of Valor reached out because they are working together to meet a need for quilts to give to family members of veterans as a form of comfort. So to help with this need, the CHALLENGE for December is to make one or more 12" patriotic red/white/blue quilt blocks to bring to BOTH the December and January guild meetings. If you can only do one, month, that works too. The block can be any design, but we have a free pattern at the link below. If you are attending these meetings by Zoom, I can arrange a pick up/drop off for the blocks. NOTE: We will have a raffle drawing for those who bring in blocks, and the prizes will be a quilty surprise, because the blocks will be used for veterans quilts.

Block exchange......Block of the month......Friendship blocks, oh no!

Three things that allow a "quarter-inch" seam allowance to be interpreted in a variety of ways! I usually have too many other projects going for Community Outreach to take the time and make a few blocks to exchange with others. More orphan blocks? Um, No Thank You. Frequently though, I get an opportunity to get creative with a pile of blocks made by different people.

When the winning name was called last month, I discovered that I would get custody of the Disappearing 9-Patch blocks that were won by Ruth. The easy thing to do would be to put them in a plastic bag with additional fabric, and let them sit on the back table for someone else to take custody! Instead, I got busy, and made two donation quilts in my go-to way---**OnPoint** (it's not just a credit union).

For some reason, sashing all those blocks is less appealing to me than cutting a bunch of alternate solid blocks and some setting triangles. It's a great way to stretch a small number of pieced blocks into something quilt-sized in a fairly quick way. I could make both a baby size and a Passage size quilt from the blocks that many of you made. Still more extra blocks were used in a row quilt of orphan blocks from Martha.

There is dreaded math involved in determining the size of triangles for **OnPoint** quilts. At my age, I usually top out at 5th grade level math and don't have time for story problems! I rely on a chart made by someone else to get the right size cut. I've pinned my chart in Pinterest, so it is handy. If you need a chart as well, here are links that will help.

I'm always pleased with the finished quilts when I set random blocks **OnPoint**. Is it ironic that my Credit Union name is also a quilting method I like to use? I will "show and share" my quilts so you can spot your blocks. Thanks for participating in the exchange, and helping to get 3 more quilts out into the community. Thank you to Lori for the plan, and thanks to Ruth and Martha for sharing. Oh, and I have custody of a lot of other orphan blocks if you would ever like to play with them. Signature quilts provide clues and preserve history

the 1800's were the Era of Sentimentality

Pre civil war= pen/ink after the civil war=embroidery

Types of signature quilts: Album, Presentation (recognizing someone), Friendship, Crazy, Fundraising/Raffle

Quilting Bee's and Westward movement signature quilts brought special memories She ended with a show and share of signature quilts from the 1800's to current. Members also showed their signature quilts.
