Quilt Trivia



Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes

January 14, 2020

President Donna Taylor opened the meeting at 6:58 by thanking everyone for showing up despite the weather. She said she was glad to hear the buses going this morning when she woke up since it meant the weather would cooperate for our meeting. She did warn that February weather can also be tricky so members needed to pay attention to Facebook and whether the Gresham-Barlow School District was open.

Vice President Linda Shaull came up to introduce MHQG member Virginia O'Donnell, our speaker for the evening. Virginia is a Master Quilter who has ONLY been quilting for 65 years. She studied Home Economics at Oregon State and comes from a family of quilters. Her dad made each of her siblings a quilt while he was healing from a broken back which she still has. And she showed a copy of the quilt she made for her first child to give to his grandchild, her first great grandchild. Virginia entered her first quilt show in 1989 and has continued to enter shows and go to conferences, earning awards, both locally and nationally, and learning new skills. Over the years, Virginia was featured artist in the Oregonian and received numerous commissions to make quilt hangings for churches and hospitals. In closing, Virginia gave a summation "To sum up my quilting life, I love learning new with each piece, and though I appreciate the awards, the making of the quilt must please me, and I appreciate all of the quilters that have been beside me on my journey. It wouldn't have been the same at all without you, my quilting friends."

After the presentation, Donna asked for nominations of the open Guild officer positions. Wendy Sternberg was nominated for President and Debbie O'Donnell for the Membership Committee. As no more nominations were forthcoming, a vote was taken and both positions were passed unanimously. Positions will be effective as of the next meeting. The Guild is still looking for another person for the Membership Committee. Donna also invited all members to the monthly Board meeting the first Tuesday of the month at Heidi's at 7:00 p.m.

Delleen got up to say that there were a lot of quilts and fabric in the back for members to work on Comfort quilts.

Sue Ainsworth Smith talked about the upcoming Stash Shuffle on National Quilt Day, March 21st. A limited number of tables will be available to members wanting to sell their extra stash or quilting notions. Tables will be \$20 for members and may be available to non-members at a later date. There will also be a jelly roll workshop followed by a jelly roll race in the afternoon. Like the tables, space is offered to members first and if space is available it will be offered to non-members.

After the break, Pat Miles, who is heading up the Traveling Quilters group, mentioned that they were have trouble getting people to come. So anyone interested can meet prior to next month's guild meeting at 6:30 p.m. in the NW corner of our room, by the stacked chairs, so an email list can get started. Some possible trips are a shop hop next month and a trip to the Albany Quilt Show.

Lori Oathes announced that there were 26 blocks of the month turned in and was quite happy to see that many for the first month. With that many blocks turned in, two names were drawn. Jere Barrett and Kim Simmons each took home 13 blocks.



This month, I'm inviting another guild member to write my column for me. It will give you a break from my typical notes about quilts, and give you info about another effort in the community to do good for others. Maybe you can help out too. Those of you who know Becky Caputo may agree that you need a nap after talking to her!! She brings in quilts by the dozens to donate, and learns binding techniques from YouTube. Her energy is contagious, and reminds me of life before I slowed down!! (Yes, I have slowed down!)

I am a guild member and a 5th grade teacher at Powell Valley Elementary in Gresham. We are learning about world biomes, climate activism, and community outreach that is accessible for 10-11 year olds. We looked into the situation with the Australia fires and found that they have halted the donations of sewn items for those animals.

Instead, I have been in touch with the Multnomah County Animal Shelter and they have a need for snuffle mats and flannel quilts with fleece backing (no batting) for dogs of all sizes. Another teacher and I are looking for donations of fleece (anything that is at least 2"x 15" we can use!!). We will be using pieces that are at least 2'x2' and larger to back quilts or cut into strips for the snuffle mats. Snuffle mats are used to hide kibble, and stimulate the dogs as they search for food.

I want to get every 5th grader in front of a sewing

machine so they can learn the basics and help beyond themselves. My timeline is to do this project mid-Feb-March. I will be at the February and March meetings to collect your donations. I also don't want anyone to go out and buy extra fleece or flannel. An important piece of this project is using things that are laying around and being efficient with what we already have in our homes to help others.

Block of the Month Challenge

Join our newest challenge! Each month we will be doing a new Block of the Month, which will allow quilters of all levels to learn or practice piecing skills, and maybe use some scraps. The blocks will then be raffled off to a lucky winner!

How it works: 1) Make the block following the requirements in the instructions.

- 2) Bring block to the MHQG meeting & turn in.
- 3) Each block gets one entry into drawing
- 4) A name is drawn & blocks are awarded to a winner!

NOTE: if there are a large amount of blocks, more than one winner will be drawn.

The **FEBRUARY BOM** Ombre Heart quilt block measures 8.5" square. (unfinished)

Fabric:

Background: use all the same fabric of <u>good quality</u> white or white low volume

Heart: colors are **pink and/or red**. For best ombre effect, use 6 different fabrics for heart.

Cutting:

Background: cut: (4) 1.5" squares, (2) 3.5" squares, (2) 1.5" x 6.5" strips and (2) 1.5" x 8.5" strips

Heart: from darkest fabric cut (2) $1.5'' \times 3.5''$ rectangles, remaining fabrics cut (5) $1.5'' \times 6.5''$ strips in lighter to darker color gradations


Quilt block assembly:

Hint: for marking diagonal lines, use very light marking pencil or chalk on wrong side so won't show through fabric.

1) Sew together the five $1.5'' \times 6.5''$ strips in order of lightest to darkest print. Press towards the dark.

2) Draw a diagonal line on each background 1.5" square. Place one on each end of the dark 1.5" x 3.5" rectangles right sides together. Stitch on the diagonal line, trim and press.

Block of the Month Challenge

3) Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of each background 3 1/2" square. Place on the bottom corner of the strip set created in Step 1 and stitch on the diagonal line. Trim and press. Repeat for other corner.



- **4)** Sew the two dark 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" units (from step 2) together along the short ends to create the top of the heart.
- 5) Sew the top and bottom of the heart together and press towards the bottom.



6) Finish up: Sew a $1.5'' \ge 6.5''$ strips right sides together to each side of the heart. Sew the $1.5'' \ge 8.5''$ strips to the remaining sides. The block should now measure 8.5'' square.
