Originally we met the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the month at Heidi's for dinner and conversation. We brought show and shares, discussed quilting techniques, challenges anyone was having and just enjoying each other's company. The group has members that are seasoned quilters to some that have just started quilting.

When COVID became an issue our group met using the 40 min. free zoom. It was quickly determined that 40 min once a month was not enough. The meetings were moved to weekly on Wednesday's. That was much better and the group agreed that this was helping all of us get through this trying time.

When the weather began getting nicer and it was light out later, we decided to continue to meet weekly but in person in the Mt. Hood Christian parking lot while maintaining the 6 ft. social distancing requirement. Everyone brought a chair, dinner, quilt for warmth, show/share and great conversation. Other types of groups were also utilizing the church parking lot for outdoor meetings. 2 of the pastors at the church ventured out one evening and introduced themselves, asked what our group was about and told us to enjoy ourselves. As the summer went on we decided to add themes to our meetings so we brought quilts that went with the theme and added costumes, hats or whatever you wanted to bring for the theme. Everyone has fun with it and there is a lot of laughter.

As the season changed from summer to fall we were still meeting at the church in the evening but an hour earlier as our spouses were concerned for our safety to be out after dark. We are utilizing the Guilds zoom account to continue meeting weekly during the winter. But some weeks we meet at a school that has a cover on Saturday as we really like to meet in person. Of course social distancing is ever most in our minds.

This has definitely brought us all closer together not just sharing our love of quilting, but sharing pieces of our lives, supporting each other through the pandemic. Without these women it would be have been much more difficult these last 9 months in 2020.

Here are some projects that as a group we have completed since the group started at the first Mt. Hood Quilt Guild meeting.

- Completed 3 charity quilts that were gifted to a group member that retired, our favorite waitress at Heidi's, a Mt. Hood Christian member
- Chose a fabric and table runner pattern the fabric had to be used in the table runner, but we also added our own complimenting fabric
- Pillow cases that were donated to several charities

1 Member brought mug rug kits for everyone that we all put together and use in our sewing rooms

All members brought 1 yd. of blue fabric and during our meeting we ripped strips and passed to the person to our right. When we were done each member had a strip from each fabric to make whatever they want

Seasonal wall hanging challenge that the group entered into the quilt show Sorted jelly roll strips that were donated, these were sold at the Guilds fabric sale Attend the quilting shows together (pre Covid)

Attend shop hops that are scheduled or that we schedule as a group (pre Covid)

- Current project is a Block Robin....each of us chose fabric colors based upon our initials. Each member chose a block to make for the other members. Every month we pass our project to another member, make our block with the fabric from the other member. We are on our last block exchange in January. The group will then use the blocks in their own quilt and will be shared with the guild members as part of show and share later in 2021.
- Next project will be a Tree Charity quilt

As we met in the church parking lot it became evident the world was changing around us without us even realizing it. There were no planes going over in early summer and as summer progressed and restrictions were lifted the airplane traffic increased each week. We noticed because they would fly right over us and interrupt our conversations! The wildfires were another challenge and we couldn't meet outside a couple of times due to the smoke, but we still did a zoom meeting. A couple that was evacuated from Estacada had parked their trailer in the church parking lot and they walked over and spoke with us. They knew we were the quilting group as a church member advised them we met there.

Hoping that other groups will see that there are ways of meeting and keeping in touch with your small quilt group and how much this has meant to our sanity and well-being over the last 9 months. We are all ready for our lives to be normal again, but it may be awhile...

Here's an update on a few things that are happening with Community Outreach. We have a new small group that meets on the 2nd Thursday of the month.

The Back Table group is open to anyone interested in quilting and sewing items for the community. The link will always be on our guild web calendar, as well as the newsletter. We hope you may want to come join the sharing and the inspirations from other members. We are winding down on a request for 70 caps for hospital workers. These requests come in every few months, and I usually have been able to handle working them in around the quilting and binding projects. One thing I've learned this time around, the male nurses need caps as well, and my supply of "manly fabric" is small! If you have boy/guy fabric to donate, we can always use it in quilts that go out.

Rita McRoberts has brought a service project to us from Restore Hope. https://

<u>www.restoretheirhope.org/</u> They need 600 Christmas stockings sewn to stuff with goodies for foster children. We hope to get kits out to you in about one month, so think about how you can help. Right now, we are collecting your extra Christmas fabric that would be kid friendly, and work for the cuff of the stockings. Rita figures we can get about 6 tops from a yard of fabric. I did a

practice stocking, and found that some of my fabrics have motifs that are too large for the approximate size of 7"x9". You may want to check your stash, and see what is available for you or others to use on this project.

The felt pieces will come to you already cut, and in bundles of 12 stockings. You can sign up for as many bundles as you want. If you are ready to help out, log on to the next Back Table meeting, or drop me an email at communityoutreach@mthoodquiltguild.com We will have more info for you soon. Thanks again to all the members who stopped by at the church on the 29th, and others who continue to sew quilts for our program. We love that you are staying involved from a distance.
