FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH- TAKE HEART



As we move into February, I start seeing hearts everywhere. It is probably from all the candy commercials, but I've always loved heart blocks. Since I am a romantic at heart, our BOM is going to be a heart. This month, we will practice our precision cutting, strip piecing, and learn one of the many ways to set blocks on point with corner triangles. I seem to say it each month, but this one goes together so smoothly, you just may want to make more than one! There are step-by-step instructions with pictures at each step that make it easy. I'm envisioning this one as a pretty table runner or wall hanging to announce the romance of February. See our FREE pattern for the Block Of the Month (BOM) on the guild's website under the Project Of the Month section. Keep an eye out because you will get a clue for the March BOM at the February meeting.

Note that our Project of the Month page is now password protected because some of the patterns are given with permission for guild members use only. The password is the same as the Members' area: Thread2023.

What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild provides a specific free pattern as a challlenge for interested guild members to make. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. One ticket is given for each block turned in. The blocks are then raffled off and the winner gets all the blocks! Sometimes when there is a large amount of blocks submitted, there may be more than one drawing for the blocks, so more than one winner!

Each block has at least one skill to practice or learn to keep our skills sharp. The blocks are chosen to include all skill levels. So whether you are learning something new, or just want to be creative, give it a try!

It is fun to finish a quick project, and who knows, you may just win the blocks!

Gresham Women's **Shelter** uses larger quilts for their cots. Susan has long-arm volunteers who quilt these larger tops for us. She also has some Chunky Brick Kits for people to piece. This group gets many of the quilt tops that members discover as a UFO, or get from other people. Quilts are usually made of adultstyle fabric, but any cheery quilt will be welcomed! Binding should be machine finished.

You can find more info about this on the guild Facebook, or talk to Susan by the Red Wagon where items are collected at the meetings. All larger quilt tops need to have a note attached with measurements listed.

Please do not give us small quilt tops that are obviously wall hangings table toppers and think that they will be used for baby donations. These items are best used for fundraising at the Summer Sale, or Quilt Show. Items with buttons, and 3-D applique are not used for the Outreach Program.
