Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes June 9, 2020 VIRTUAL MEETING

Wendy Sternberg opened the meeting explaining the set-up of the meeting. She mentioned that there would be two video presentations links that go along with our meeting that were sent out in an email along with the meeting link.

Wendy thanked all who helped make these meetings possible. She also explained that June 9th is a special day for the Guild as it is our 5th Anniversary. She commented on how much she has learned and how many wonderful quilters she has meet. Wendy went on to explain the new things up on our web page including a donate button and a way for members to sign up and pay for membership dues. She then welcomed a new member and invited everyone to look at our new site.

Wendy talked about the two videos. Since it is interesting to see how everyone sets up their sewing area, Becky Caputo gives a tour of her sewing space. Debbie O'Donnell from the Membership Committee talked about renewals. Membership renewal are due the end of July. She said the process is explained in the newsletter but she gave an overview. The preferable way is to print off the membership form found at the bottom of the MEMBERS' AREA on the web page and mail a check to the PO Box listed on the form as no on-line fees would apply. Also on the web page is a new link for MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL AND NEW. Click the link and pick the appropriate box for renewal. This method uses your PayPal account. Treasurer Laura Rom assures everyone that this is very reliable, secure and trustworthy method of payment.

Laurie Oathes welcomed everyone and addressed survey comments regarding Block of the Month and whether we could do something by mail or some other kind of exchange. We are listening to you, but we just haven't figured out if there is anything we could do about that. For right now we are going to continue to do what we are doing. This next BOM is a two part block and it is also a project. This month it is a Churn Dash block. She recommended not using a large scale print, even if there is plenty of contrast. Instructions are on the web site for a 6 ½" unfinished block. You will be making two blocks instead of one. The second part will be coming next month. Everyone who enters this will be a winner. Also in the survey, a challenge was mentioned. We are talking about that, but haven't decided so stay tuned for that maybe in late summer or fall. Laurie suggested watching the videos and put a plug in for our business members. A lot of them are open but may require masks but at least you can touch the fabric.

Sue Ainsworth Smith came on to talk about Open Sew. Google Meet has been tested as it is something that is available to us through the guild. It will be tried out this Sunday, June 14th. Interested members were instructed to email Sue so an invite could be sent out for a virtual Open Sew.

The retreat was the topic of discussion for Barbara Belgrave, Retreat Coordinator. Barbara gave a description of her job as Retreat Coordinator in a normal year, which this is not a normal year. The first thing to do is to contact the venue with the dates desired. Then the deposit is paid to the venue and a contract is signed. You can form a committee or do it all yourself, as It is very easy to do. Then you take sign ups and deposits from the members. Then on your own or with your committee, you figure out your games and gifts. You will get a lot of ideas for games and gifts and if you take notes, it makes

the job a lot easier. Then create the retreat packet with all the forms. The meal allergy forms will need to be sent in to the venue and you will decide on meals. You will also need to keep an account of monies spent and received. After the retreat is over you will need to turn in a full account to the treasurer. This year we will have a retreat, but it will be virtual. All cash already paid in will be returned as checks and are being process now. Sign-ups for this year's virtual retreat will be after membership renewals as only members can attend the retreat. If you would like to help on any committees, please let the President or Retreat Coordinator know.

Wendy explained that Laura Rom got a wonderful letter from someone who received one of our community outreach quilts and has been asked to read it to everyone. Before reading the letter, Laura made a note that she would be sending Retreat refund checks to member's addresses on file. If members have moved since membership sign up last year, they would need to let Barbara, Retreat Coordinator, Debbie, Membership or Wendy, Treasurer at the emails listed on the website or newsletter. Then she read the awesome note she received. The writer explained that her husband had passed in April 2020 at Mt Hood Medical Center. When she went in to say goodbye, she said he was covered in the most beautiful quilt she had ever seen. When she left him for the last time, the nurses in the ICU gave her the quilt and she said that she would treasure it always. In the PS, she commented that she would love to come to a quilt show and would like a copy of our newsletters. Laura responded with information on our newsletter and commented on how nice it was hear how much the quilt meant to her. Laura stated how nice it was to hear that what we are doing matters so much to someone.

Wendy then did the Birthday drawing. The winner was Maureen O'Conner. Wendy commented that if we don't meet till fall, she would figure out a way get the Birthday gift cards out by mail.

Delleen Kompkoff remarked how much she is learning about the online meetings. And she complimented Staci Wendland on all the hard work she does on the newsletter and on the web site. Delleen thanked everyone who turned in their survey. Delleen then described a new pattern for masks on YouTube that addresses the size issues. Her information came up on her screen then to show the results of the survey. The total number of personal protection made to date was 4852 masks, 416 ear protectors and 282 caps. She has also been looking at other types of mask patterns. Delleen promised prizes to members returning a completed survey based on a random selection. She then explained her random number selection committee, her granddaughters. Each granddaughter picked a number and Susan, Laura M, and Virginia C all won a packages of charm squares. Delleen then showed pictures and talked about an old TV show called Romper Room. She said she has faint memories of a lady who had a magic mirror and could see all the kids watching and would call out some names. Delleen said she feels like the Romper Room lady but she does not have any magic mirror. So she would like everyone to contact a Board member, talk to other quilters, and let us know what is going on out there. She also gave come tips that will be in the newsletter. And, she showed a new mask pattern that will be shared in the newsletter. It has a flap that folds up and helps prevent glasses from fogging up.

Wendy again invited all members to view the two links of videos and to let her know if anyone would like to join the Board meetings, which are two weeks prior to the Guild meeting.

Staci did the Show and Share followed by Wendy signing off.

Hello everyone, I hope you are enjoying the summer weather. Summer hasn't been a busy time for quilt donations in the past, too many other things to do! Since many of us are staying closer to home this year, you may find that you have some time to sew for community outreach.

We got a request from Human Solutions, wondering if our members could make face masks for the people in their programs. Well, I know we've made over 4000 in the last few months, so I'm guessing our members can make them pretty fast, by now!! If you have a few more minutes of time to donate, and still have stash fabric, you might want to help them out. Any masks you have can be dropped off at Susan Ainsworth Smith's house. She will collect them, as well as quilts, underwear, socks, and toiletries, and make a delivery in a few weeks. Now that masks are required in public places, I'm guessing there will be a greater need. Thanks to all of you who help out with this project.

I am slowly figuring out how community outreach can stay active, when we are no longer having meetings at the church. For the next few months, we are going to try a committee approach. You know that Becky and Donna have rescued donated fabric, and planned a sale for members. You may know that Susan has purchased a huge roll of batting, and is ready to share with people who are quilting our tops. She is also monitoring the Facebook page, and coordinating things that arise from there.

I am leaving most of the "people" part of the committee to others for a few months. Collection, distribution, and coordination—that will now be done by some willing committee members. My job for the next couple of months will be to just focus on the quilt tops and fabric that we have accumulated for the last several years. By taking a break from the other tasks, I hope to get caught up with things that have been donated. The first part of June, I got 58 quilts out to agencies. There still is a big pile to finish, but I'm determined to get them done.

For those of you who have been around for awhile, you know I've asked for more quilters to get involved. Probably at most meetings, as well as in each newsletter, I've shared how difficult it is to keep up with the generous number of tops and UFOs that people give us. I'm hoping that this change will allow us to find another way to involve more members in the finishing process. Any tops that come in for the next few months will be handled by the "committee". Before you pass off a top to them, you may just want to quilt it yourself, and save a step for someone else.

I'm very thankful for the help that has been given. If you would like to become more involved, an email is the best way to volunteer. Without the opportunity to connect with small sewing groups and our monthly meetings, this is a challenging time. I am hopeful that by having a "committee" approach, we will find more ways to keep members actively involved, and give me some time to get caught up behind the scenes.

One more opportunity in the next month or so - Our friend Susan Schmidt from Quilts Beyond Borders will be collecting quilts to go their annual fall drive of quilts for the Navajo Nation. She will have more information for us next month. You may have one quilt you want to set aside for that project.





Three quilt patterns for 40 x 60" quilts, from Delleen:

CHARMING Charming: adjective. Something that is attractive or delightful, endearing in some way. Something likeable.

72 5 inch squares + sashing +borders = 40"x60" quilt



sew 12 scrappy blocks into long column

make 6 columns

using 2.5" strips, put 5 sashing strips between columns

sew 2.5" borders to top, bottom, and both sides

Scrappy Nifty Fifty
50 rectangles + 50 squares = one quilt 40" x 60"
squares are 4.5" squares are 4.5"


rectangles are 4.5"x 8.5"

Start by sewing together 50 rectangle+square units.


Build blocks by sewing 3 units into 12" squares for Block A

Sew 4 units into Block B (12"x16")

Quilt is made of 5 rows for 60" length



Two Plus Two: Two Squares and Two Rectangles 40" x60" rectangles are 4.5"x 8.5" sauares are 4.5"



Using large square, small square, and two rectangles, make 12" (finished) square. Make 15 blocks.

Feel free to mix blocks in your

dk.

Quilt will use 5 rows of 3 blocks, making a 36"x 60" quilt. Rotate blocks for variety. Add 2.5" strips on each side to grow quilt to 40" wide. If using baby type fabrics, quilt will only use 9 blocks.
