Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes— May 14, 2019

With Donna Taylor out of town, Vice President Pat Curtis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Despite the large crowd expected, Pat suggested the weather and the Trail Blazer playoff game contributed to the light turnout. Pat introduced the evening's speaker, Lynn Czaban. They met when Pat had a family picture, which included a beloved Grandma, made into a quilt. This has become one of Pat's most prized possession.

Lynn Czaban, of Eugene, started quilting in 1985 when she was pregnant and decided to make a baby quilt. In 2005, she was given a quilting challenge and with inspiration by Susan Carlson, (https://susancarlson.com/) she started making portrait quilts. The first was of her granny. Since then, she has expanded her talents and won numerous awards for her portrait quilts. Her advice is to always get permission before using a photograph that is not yours and avoid copyrighted photos. This is important since some quilt shows require documented proof of permission. There are also a number of websites that offer free photos. She also mentioned that there are many options available to make portrait quilts, but her preference is Steam-a-Seam.

After the presentation, Pat reminded everyone that membership renewal starts in August with a new rate of \$25. She also mentioned some great upcoming speakers. Some of the speakers will be offering full day class options after their presentations. Tonight 77 members were in attendance along with 1 new member and 6 guests.

The Guild has newly printed brochures available. If members would like to take a small stack to hand out when they go to area quilt shops, brochures are available at the back table. During the break, members had opportunities to buy into the UFO challenge, see Elaine McCloskey postcards and to sign up for interest in a future class, and buy Opportunity Quilt raffle tickets along with all the other usual options. A break was announced from 7:37 to 7:50.

When the meeting reconvened, the birthday drawing and other door prizes were done.

Debbie Stoffer talked about the Opportunity Quilt raffle. She has arranged to sell tickets at several farmer's markets and First Friday events. Volunteers interested in selling tickets at these events were encouraged to contact Debbie. She will also be contacting members who indicated on their signup sheet they would be interested in helping.

Delleen said she is no longer doing two jobs and encouraged attendees to check out Gresham High School's presentation of 'JOSEPH AND THE AMAZING TECHNICOLOR DREAMCOAT" and see the fantastic costumes sewn by her and other seamstresses. The play would be performed in that very room over the weekend.

Pat Miles, co-chair of the Quilt Show committee, said that meetings are being held buy they need information and decisions from sub committees as the show is coming up fast. The next meetings will be held 5/19/19 at Heidi's @ 2:00 p.m. There are also lots of opportunities to volunteer. The Boutique Committee and Sponsor and Vendor Committees were meeting. Marie Anderson has arranged for local dignitaries to award ribbons at the show.

Pat stated that her position as vice president runs out in July. She said the job is not hard and she would be willing to work with someone to get them going.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:22 p.m.

There will be some quilts displayed as well, so people can see examples of our work.

If you have donated a quilt in the past, I may have decided to hold it for fundraising purposes at our boutique. If you have given fabric, I may be passing some on to the boutique committee for use in items sewn by members. If you have an idea for a project to sew for the committee, I can probably find some fabric for you to use. I recently passed on some Christmas fabric, but there is a lot of stuff in the "Guild Stash" and I'd love to share it with you. If you need something, just drop me an email with your request, and I'll see what we have.

As the months leading up to the quilt show are quickly passing, be sure to think of ways you can volunteer to help. Some of the jobs are things you can do now, some will be just the week of the show. By volunteering, you not only will be helping get some jobs done, you will be able to get to know more of our generous members who give time and talent to the guild. I know we have a huge talent bank in this group, because I see it every month as you help me get quilts out to the community.

This month, we received a check for \$300 from the Pacific Power Foundation for their **Global Days of Service** program. One of our members kept track of her volunteer time, and submitted forms for me to validate and return.
