
2400 Quilts - How Did We Get Here?



May 10, 2022 MHQG Member's Meeting

The meeting is on Zoom. Stephanie H. will be running the Zoom part of the meetings until the subscription is up in September. Then the meetings will switch over to Google Meets. Welcome to all guests and new members.

Dottie: Christina Comeli class was cancelled- this will be rescheduled . May 21st- Firefly tote class by Camille Ainsworth. \$45 for class, \$25 for kit.

Dottie introduced the speaker: Laverne Lewis from Women-Sew Global Foundation organization. All of us learned to sew somewhere from someone. When you are a sewer who learned from you mother it becomes part of your DNA. About 6 years ago she was working at the Rockwood Centershe started teaching women how to sew. This just grew and grew into a regular class at Rockwood Center. Multi-generations were learning how to sew. When the Center wanted to start charging the women the class ended and the it was the beginning of Women-Sew Foundation. At the beginning of this program the pandemic hit- she was able to do classes & grow the Collective on Zoom. The women have made close to 20,000 masks. It is a sewing collective to raise awareness for Women and Girls. Many machines have been gifted to the members- hand delivered by Laverne. There are 9 Collective leaders- each one has a group that represent their world. The ladies attend 6-8 classes to be able to bring their machines home. Part of the sewing is economic development- learning to sell & market their products. Stitching Lives Together Residency Program- incredible! Also brought a program to a park (Park grant). Stitching Lives Together Project Bag- filled with things needed to start sewing including patterns and fabric. They love donations! That's why we sew. If you would like to teach a class/special skill- contact Laverne. Would love to have them at our quilt show (Featured Non-Profit Vendor option?), Website has donation information. Laverne's contact information is in the newsletter.

- Healthy, non-perishable snacks


