

MARCH BLOCK OF THE MONTH- FLOATING CHURN DASH



This month we are floating a vintage block. This means the design appears to float without touching the edges of the block. It makes it a little simpler to match up sections and make beautiful points! Careful measuring and a 1/4" seam will be important this month. We will be doing black and white this month to really allow the design to pop. The picture above looks like tan, but it is white- the lighting was bad when I took the picture. See our FREE pattern for this Block Of the Month (BOM) on the guild's website under the <u>Project Of the Month</u> section.

The Project Of The Month section is password protected because some designers have given permission to guild members. Password is **Thread2023.**



What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild provides a specific free pattern as a challenge for interested guild members to make. Most blocks have a skill to learn or practice to keep our skills sharp. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. One raffle ticket is given for each block turned in- and you can make more than one for more chances to win! A drawing is done for those who turned in blocks and the winner gets all the blocks! Sometimes when there is a large amount of blocks submitted, there may be more than one winner!

Give it a try- It is fun to finish a quick project, and you may just win the blocks!







2023 Mt. Hood Quilt Guild UFO Challenge

IT'S BACK!!! Dig out your UnFinished Objects for chances to win!

The UFO project challenge is a fundraiser where 50% of the funds go directly to the Guild, and the remaining 50% will be used for cash prizes for the winners.



HOW IT WORKS:

- 1) Buy in for \$10 (cash/card/check). Buy-in starts at March meeting.2) Each \$10 give you up to 5 chances to win.
 - 3) Complete previously started projects, then show your finished projects at guild meetings starting in March. You get a drawing entry for each finished project up to 5. (You keep items)
- 4) Drawing will be at the September meeting after the Show & Share.
 - a) First prize wins 1/2 prize money.
 - b) Second prize wins ½ of remaining prize money.
 - c) Third prize wins remaining prize money less \$10.
 - d) Fourth prize wins \$10

Example: \$400, Prize pool = \$200, 1st =100, 2nd=\$50, 3rd=\$40, 4th=\$10 And there will be a few fun surprises along the way



GUIDELINES:

- 1) Finished quilts must be pieced, quilted and bound.
- 2) Must be completed between February 2023 and September 2023.

(No previously completed items please)

- 3) Minimum size is 36x48" or equivalent.
- 4) Buy-in as many times as you like throughout the challenge. So go through those old boxes, bags and drawers to DIG OUT THOSE UFOs,

Members present: 95 in person, 17 on zoom, 5 new members, 8 visitors, 125 total

Meeting started at 7:00 by Marie Anderson

Guild voted on new President: Susan Ainsworth Smith; Treasurer: Donna Taylor; Membership

Chair: Barb Junor

Susan took over the gavel from Marie and continued the meeting as the new President.

The speakers were Jean and Steve Ludeman. Jean is an award winning MHQG member and her husband Steve is an artist. There is a commonality between art and quilting in that both require composition and design. Quilters are fabric artists. Jean says she quilts because she feels her quilts will be around long after she is gone. Steve said his art tells stories of history and that he is currently working on a Lewis and Clark trail project which is painting scenes beginning at Harpers Ferry and continuing west. There was a slideshow of ways to use color and how the use of color makes a quilt look 3D. Quilts, as in art, have a focal point / point of interest and balance.
