
President's Message

Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Minutes- April 9, 2019

President Donna called the meeting to order promptly at 7:00 p.m. The on-time door prize was drawn and Donna explained that we would be changing the order of the meeting around a bit. Our presenter would be first in the meeting with Guild business afterwards. This gives the presenter a better chance to do a more thorough presentation.

Deb Hart from Pink Sistas was introduced and presented with three tubs filled with 100 pillowcases made by the guild. Deb thanked the guild for the pillowcases and explained how this organization started. In 2006 she lost her 22 year old son unexpectedly. Seven months later she was diagnosed with stage 3 breast cancer which required a double mastectomy. This double whammy caused her to look at the support system for women. She found a lack of support for cancer survivors and decided to start Pink Sistas as a way to support women after treatment. Over the past eight years her organization has grown. Ninety women attended her weekend retreats on the Columbia Gorge boat house. And Jan Weston Kia donated an eleven passenger party barge. She truly appreciated the support from the Guild and mentioned another way to support her organization was a May 18th Sparkle Fundraiser and auction. Pat introduced our speaker for this evening Rosemary Burris. This upstate NY native moved to Hillsboro after her time in the Peace Corp. She loved dogs all her life, but never considered herself an artist. Taught by Susan Carlson, she started creating quilt collages using hundreds of different pieces of fabric. This techniques gave her the ability to create shape and dictate focus using hues, values and patterns that took her work in a totally different direction than traditional quilting. She wowed the audience with many pieces of artwork that were truly lifelike. She has upcoming classes in May and November at Pioneer Quilts in Milwaukie and will continue to teach in Ashland along with other locations around the country. Donna came up after the presentation to do more door prizes. She also talked about the Opportunity Quilt. This quilt was made by people around the world and raffle tickets could be purchased at the table in the back. Also the Guild has newly printed updated brochure out and volunteers were asked to distribute them around the metro area as they went to different shops. Donna stated that 103 members were in attendance including 6 new members and 11 guests. A break was taken from 8:05 to 8:15.

Pat came up to say the Quilt Show meeting was currently scheduled for Sunday @ Heidi's, but since it conflicted with Open Sew, it may be moved. Watch for notification. She was proud to announce that this year's quilt show would have a corporate sponsor. Next month's speaker will be Lynn Czaban who does award winning people portraits. Check out her Facebook page.

Lori announced that she volunteered to be the UFO Challenge coordinator. Signups will begin in May with the drawing in November. This is a fundraiser. Half the money collected stays with the Guild and the other half is awarded to the winners. Please see the newsletters for additional details.

Delleen received a great amount of Hawaiian fabric and has started a new travelling box. There are pre-cut squares and yardage. She made the first quilt and it has already been signed out for April. 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Quilt Show Update



2019 Mt. Hood Quilt Guild UFO Challenge

Dig out your UnFinished Objects for chances to win!

The UFO project challenge is a fundraiser where 50% of the funds go directly to the Guild, and the remaining 50% will be used for prizes to the challenge winners.

HOW IT WORKS:

- 1) Buy in for \$10 (cash/check).
- 2) \$10 gives you up to 6 chances to win.
- 3) Complete previously started projects, then show your finished projects at guild meetings starting in May. You get a raffle ticket for each finished project (you keep items).
- 4) Drawing will be at the November meeting after the Show & Share.
 - a) First prize wins 1/2 prize money
 - b) Second prize wins 1/2 of remaining prize money.
 - c) Third prize wins remaining prize money less \$10.
 - d) Fourth prize wins \$10
 Example: \$400, Prize pool=\$200, 1st=\$100, 2nd=\$50, 3rd=\$40, 4th=\$10

GUIDELINES:

- 1) Finished quilts must be pieced, quilted and bound.
- 2) Must be completed between April 2019 and Nov. 2019. (no previously completed items please)
- 3) Minimum size is 36 x 48" or equivalent.
- 4) Buy-in as many times as you like throughout the challenge.
