Pumpkin Spice.....it's that time again. I've never refused a piece of pumpkin pie or pumpkin bread, but the ever-present "pumpkin spice" is a little more than I've understood. It seems that it arrived even earlier this year, but it reminds me that fall, cooler weather, and school are coming soon. It has made me remember to use more flannel on the backs of quilts (we have lots!) and probably influenced some of my color choices as I put scrap quilts together.

There are a few opportunities in September that will encourage you to spend some time on quilt donations. The members of the fall retreat have been encouraged to make a baby size quilt for **Boxes of Love**. If you are retreating (or not!) please ask for some of our fabric to make a baby quilt. I have lots to share: kits, fabric, batting, backs. Drop me an email, and I'll bring your supplies to the September meeting. Remember the **Baby Box**? It is still filled with great pieces from our members who shared the box each month when we met in person. I'd really like to get that box back into circulation. I would also encourage you to **quilt and bind your baby quilt**. It will free up time for others, give you some easy quilting practice, and get the finished quilt into circulation more quickly.

Those of you who watched our guild zoom meeting about quilt donations probably remember the moving story shared by the chaplain at **Mt. Hood Medical Center**. I think many of you who made a quilt of Hawaiian fabric were touched by his story. I've just quilted another Hawaiian quilt, and the Hawaiian Box will be back at our in-person meeting. One more thing that seemed to have stopped during our zoom meetings, this box is filled with Hawaiian shirt cut-offs that make wonderful quilts. Some quilters have taken the box, and shared the piecing with a friend - they have some creative fun, and we get more than one quilt returned. Each month, we donate at least 15 quilts to the hospital Passage Program. These Hawaiian quilts are great for that purpose.

One other reminder for you is about **Quilts Beyond Borders**. This international program has been donating quilts around the world, and has been getting fewer quilts because of the cancellation of many quilt shows. We know about this program, because the NW coordinator actively supports our guild with fabric and batting, and many members sew quilts to donate to the program. If you have a top to donate, you can drop it off at our meeting, and we will pass it on. They are currently collecting for the annual Navajo initiative, giving quilts to preschool kids, elders, and many

I would like to thank all the members who continue to support our outreach program. In the last week, we delivered 19 baby-sized quilts, 20 quilts to Human Solutions, and it's time again for the drop-off at the hospital. I'm really optimistic about returning to in-person meetings, getting to see everyone at the "back table", and seeing what you've been sewing. If I'm standing there, chatting and drinking my latte, it definitely will not be Pumpkin Spice flavor. I like a lot of variety in my scrappy quilts, but my coffee needs to taste like coffee!!

Fall Virtual Retreat

We're weeks away from the start of the Zoom Fall Retreat which begins on Thursday September 30th. There are 4 spots remaining as of this newsletter and you can join us by sending in a check for \$40 or by using PayPal on the guild website. We will have retreat goodie bags, door prizes, a Mystery Quilt by Tomme Fent, games, a charity quilt project, demonstrations, fun and fellowship.

The retreat goodie bags will be distributed at the September 14th guild meeting and that will be the final opportunity to sign up for retreat if there are any remaining spaces. The August Birthday winner: Susan Calef

Delleen did a Charity Outreach update. Remember we give quilts, monthly, to Mt. Hood Medical Center (Passages program), Ronald McDonald House, Human Solutions, and Boxes of Love. We also sew/support other projects as the opportunity arises (Christmas Stockings for Foster Children, quilts for fire survivors, Aprons for Food Pantries, etc). There have been "Quilt Exchanges" every 6 weeks. Thank you to MQL for being to drop off place. There are plenty of quilting opportunities: Making tops, quilting, long-arm quilt, binding- your choice!

Dottie introduced out speaker: Christina Cameli. Christina talked about 9° and 10° circle wedge rulers. She wrote a book: Wedge Quilt Workshop which outlines how to use both the 9° and 10° circle wedge rulers. Some hints include: you can use either end of the ruler, you can machine or hand applique the inside and outside circles, ombre fabrics look really cool, strip between the wedges looks fun too, trim up the circles at 1/8th of a circle to stay accurate. You can make a magic triangle with the 10° circle wedge ruler.

You can find Christina on her blog, You-Tube and her books

There is the possibility of a Christina Cameli Wedge Quilt class on a Saturday.

If you need or could use Pier One plastic bags- let Delleen know- she can get you set up with lots of bags.
