# **PROGRAM AND CLASS OPPORTUNITIES**

November's Speaker is Robin O'Neil Time for us to think outside the box! Robin O'Neil will be our featured speaker during the November guild meeting. She will be talking about IMPROVISATIONAL QUILTING. She will compare traditional quilts to modern and to improv quilts. She will bring over 20 quilts as visual examples. Robin was a special education teacher for 35 years and began making quilts the same year that she entered the classroom. Her interest in both education and quilting was sparked by children who seemed fearless about color, pattern, and play. She says life is too short for stress and fretting, especially about quilts. Robin also offers a class learning opportunity called Step Ladder, which teaches 7 different improv techniques. We can host the class if there is enough interest, at a cost of \$35 per person. ### **NOVEMBER 2022 BLOCK OF THE MONTH - HOT MUGS**

True to Oregon fall, the rain has come, and with it a little chill in the air. I've found myself reaching for hot tea, coffee, or cocoa to help warm up. So this month's pattern was inspired by all the warm beverages we will enjoy over the next few months.



This is a confident beginner level pattern that you can do. Read directions carefully, and you are on your way! We have added a little challenge of fussy cutting to decorate your mug. The block goes together easily, and you may want to make an extra one as a mug rug to keep or give as a quick gift.

The pattern is posted on the Guild website in the Project Of the Month section. <u>Click Here</u>

BOM DRAWING: One block = 1 ticket for the drawing.

### What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild has a Block Of the Month challenge where a specific free pattern is designated for interested guild members to make. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. One ticket is given for each block turned in.

The blocks are then raffled off and the winner gets all the blocks!

Each block has at least one skill to practice or learn to keep our skills sharp. This month we will fussy cut a design to decorate the mug. The blocks are chosen to include all skill levels. So whether you are learning something new, or just want to be creative, give it a try!

It is fun to finish a quick project, and you may win the blocks !


