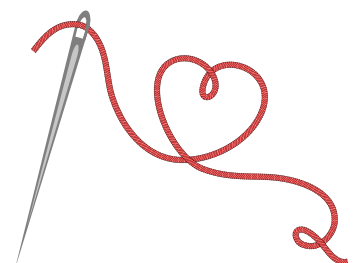
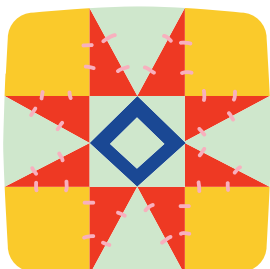

OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH: **BLACK CATS**

Since October is the month black cats come to mind, we have a cute little cat block to make. This month we are practicing our sew & flip, or "flippy" corners, careful cutting, and trying labeling the pieces to keep track of similar sized pieces. The colors will be black for the cat and light to medium-light grey background fabric for a good contrast. The cute little plain face is ready for the winners to embellish as much or as little as they like. This petite block is only 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" unfinished and goes together almost as fast as you can say Trick-or-Treat.

See the **FREE** pattern for this Block Of the Month (BOM) on the guild's website under the Project Of the Month section.

TRICK-OR-TREAT SPECIAL: If you turn in 2 blocks, you will get 4 (yes 4) entries into the drawing! Depending on the amount of block turned in, there may be more than one winner! You can make as many blocks as you want to enter as many times as you want. **NOTE:** Extra Trick-or-treat entries only given for sets of 2 blocks.

What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild provides a specific free pattern as a challenge for interested guild members to make. Most blocks have a skill to learn or practice to keep our skills sharp. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. Normally one raffle ticket is given for each block turned in, and you can make more than one block for more chances to win! Watch for specials like this month where you have a change to get more tickets to win! A drawing is done for those who turned in blocks and the winner gets all the blocks! Sometimes when there is a large amount of blocks submitted, there may be more than one winner!

Give it a try- It is fun to finish a quick project, and you may just win the blocks !

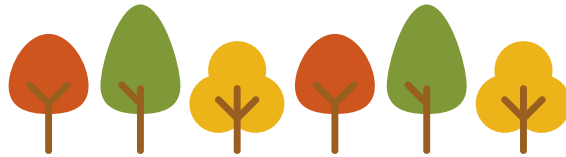
October hint: Directional fabrics can be cute in this pattern, but be careful when cutting out and when sewing pieces together to insure your directional fabric is all going in the same direction !!! Press seam as you go to help everything lie flatter. Line up seams carefully and pin.

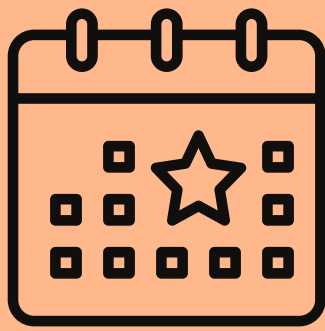

MEETING NOTES

MHQG Member Meeting 9/7/23, opened at 7:01 pm by President Susan Ainsworth Smith
Member Attendance: In Person 108, Zoom 5, Visitors (Guests) 1, New 6; Susan welcomed everyone
Door Prizes given out: 5, with UFO & BOM numbers later in these notes

Announcements: Free Table and Block of the Month (BOM) had switched locations on the meeting floor, and Susan encouraged all interested to sign up for the Teddy Bear Parade before next Wednesday. Skip A Week's Guild Quilt show will be held September 15 & 16 in Estacada.

VP Tricia introduced Speaker Cynthia Brunz: "Turn Your Scraps into Quilts That Turn Heads" Quilting is more fun than Housework.... She presented a large trunk show of her work that included tumbler, flying geese, pineapple, bowtie, and string blocks; she also showed the use orphan blocks and a postage stamp hombra work. All of her quilts were made from scraps.

Break from 7:49 – 8:05: Susan reminded everyone to visit all the tables around the room; Free Table, Skip A Week, UFO, and 24's a Charm, Stitching Comforts, the new Wednesday Community Sew (at the First Baptist Church on Powell), and the Teddy Bear Parade sign up.

Post-break Announcements: Susan announced the Quilt Show & Craft Sale at Hoodland Lutheran Church on September 30, and that Lori Holt has a YouTube video about the design board speaker Cynthia Brunz mentioned tonight Lori Holt - YouTube.

Lori Oathes BOM & UFO (fundraiser for guild activities): 59 BOM entries; six members won nine blocks, and one member won five blocks. 85 UFO quilts entered with 34 signups; four winners divided \$170 cash, while the other \$170 benefits the guild (equipment purchases, speaker fees, etc.). Susan asked that we all thank Lori for her HUGE contributions of time and work to the Guild.

Birthday Drawing: Winner is Lou Devine! The group sang Happy Birthday to all September birthday members.

Show & Share: Ten members who entered quilts in the recent Clackamas County Fair showed quilts which won awards varying from first, second, or third place, Judges' Choice, Best of Show, or Division Champion. The non-fair entry quilts brought up the rear with equally wonderful work.

Last Announcement: Gresham United Women in Faith are presenting "Quilts and More" on October 13 & 14, by Dr. Laverne Lewis (MHQG Member) including "Symbolic Meanings of Quilt Signs Related to the Underground Railroad", at Gresham United Methodist Church, 620 NW 8th Street in Gresham.

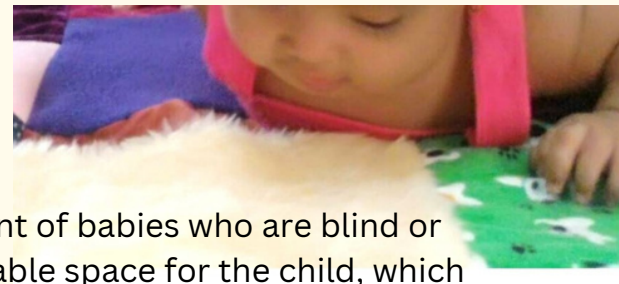

TACTILE QUILTS

Columbia Regional Inclusive Services



Tactile quilts are a wonderful tool to aid in the development of babies who are blind or visually impaired. They help to create a defined and predictable space for the child, which is important in developing their trust to move and explore. They help develop skills in tactile and visual exploration, fine motor skills, oral development, tummy time and rolling over, comparative concepts, and so much more!

We will be providing 48" square floor quilts used for tummy time. The quilts are made with sensory rich blocks of a wide variety of fabric textures, trims, notions, or flaps and pockets. The quilts are backed with a dark solid fleece, allowing that side to provide high contrast to items placed upon it. We will have more information, and sample quilt blocks at the meeting.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- Make a 10.5" block from washable, textured fabric. Add trims by sewing securely. No buttons, please. Drop off your block at the back table.
- Drop off usable trims or other items that could be used in quilts. Repurpose a motif from a kid's flip sequin shirt.
- Come to Community Sew Oct. meeting and sew donated blocks to make quilt top.

Help us out!

As a guild member, it's likely you've been offered fabric donations from people interested in giving away "things for sewing".

We get emails from the public frequently with offers of fabric and other items. It's a good way to get things for fundraising at the SUMMER SALE. Because of that, we've developed this info sheet as a way to respond to emails.

This info may help you explain the types of donations we like!



Info about Fabric Donations

Mt. Hood Quilt Guild does accept fabric donations from the public. Before contacting us about your donation, please check to be sure to follow our guidelines.

- Fabric needs to be clean, (no pet hair, and odor-free).
- Fabric pieces should be at least fat quarter size - 18"x22" and larger.
- Fabric should be 100% cotton to be used in quilts.
- Fabric that is over 20 years old isn't needed for our outreach quilts.
- Finished quilt tops can be donated.
- Batting is accepted as long as it is odor-free, and bug-free.
- Quilting notions, thread, some patterns will be accepted for fundraising purposes.
- Things like upholstery fabric, garment fabric, denim, satin, are better used by other community organizations.
- Please contact us if you have questions about other items you wish to donate. Donations that only include our needed items are appreciated, and don't require our volunteers to find other places where the fabric will be accepted.

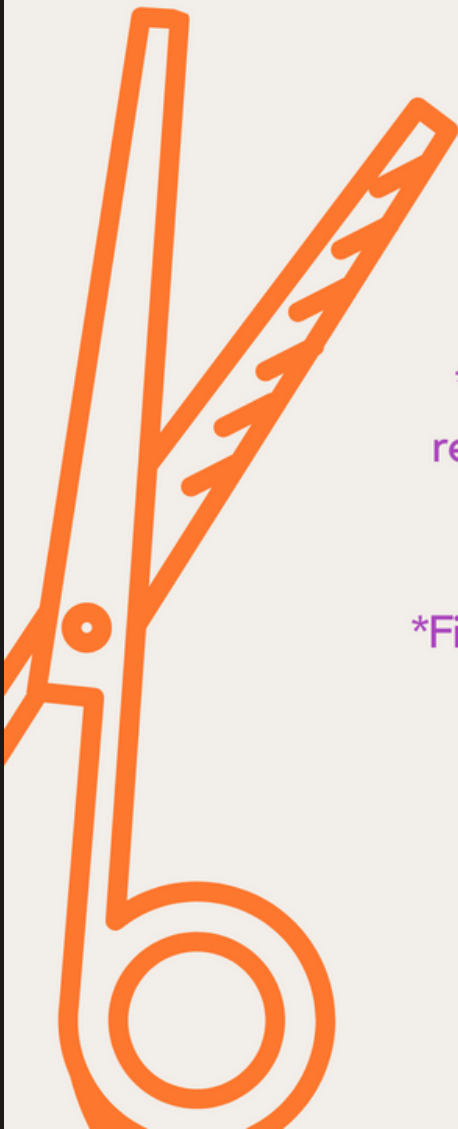
