We are very excited for our September guest speaker! Aren't we all looking for ways to use our scraps?

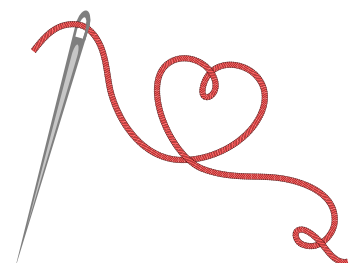
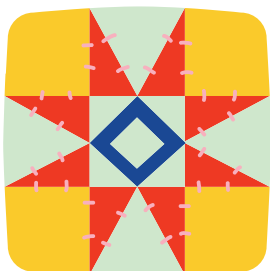
Cynthia Brunz will show us how to:

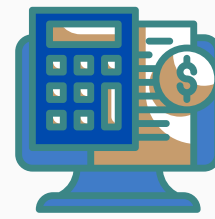

SEPTEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH: 3-D PINWHEELS



Summer weather and long awaited cooling breezes reminded me of running around with pinwheels when I was a kid trying to make them spin. Now I've found a block that is almost as fun. The 3-D Pinwheel block turns so fancy you would never guess that it only has 3 seams- yep, only three. This month we are learning some basic fabric folding that can easily turn your blocks three dimensional. We will also be practicing sewing through many layers. Our colors will be bright summer colors with a white or white-on-white background fabric to really set those bright colors off. This block would look great in table runners, wall hangings, bags, etc.

Back to school special: If you turn in 2 different color blocks, you will get 3 entries into the drawing! The winner will get 9 blocks, so depending on the amount of block turned in, there may be more than one winner! You can make as many blocks as you want to enter as many times as you want.

What is the Block Of the Month or "BOM"?

Each month the Guild provides a specific free pattern as a challenge for interested guild members to make. Most blocks have a skill to learn or practice to keep our skills sharp. The block(s) are then made and brought to the meeting to turn in for a drawing. The blocks are displayed to inspire all members. Normally one raffle ticket is given for each block turned in- and you can make more than one for more chances to win! A drawing is done for those who turned in blocks and the winner gets all the blocks! Sometimes when there is a large amount of blocks submitted, there may be more than one winner!

Give it a try- It is fun to finish a quick project, and you may just win the blocks !

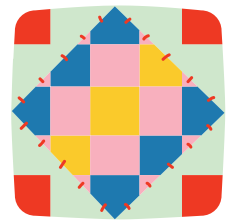
September hint: Pressing is your friend !!! Press seams open as you go to help everything lie flatter. Don't skip pressing as it really does make a difference in how flat your block lies. Line up seams carefully and pin. Open to make sure they line up correctly. Thick seams tend to shift as you pin. A sharp new needle may be helpful.

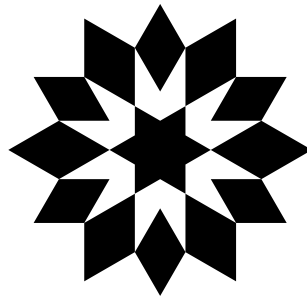

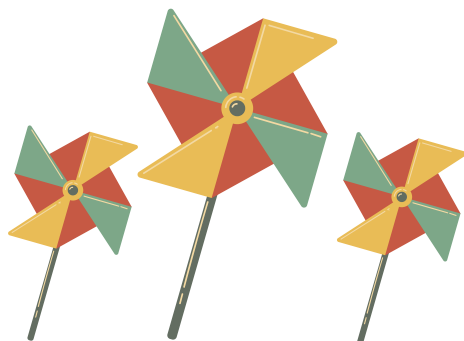

Some of you may remember the early days of the Guild, when we had monthly access to an Open Sew quilting space at Fabric Depot. Members could come, visit, and work on Community Outreach projects, or personal projects. Those were the days of making aprons for community kitchens! The guild has had a lot of ups and downs since then.



We have found a way to have in-person sewing again. Members can come to help work on kits for **Community Outreach**, or bring a personal project to sew while we visit and learn from each other.

We have space for up to 25 members to attend each month. You need to bring your own food, beverage, sewing supplies, rulers, rotary cutter, power strip, light, etc. We will need a few hands to help with clean-up and vacuuming at the end of the day.

There will be an ironing station, and cutting mat station available.

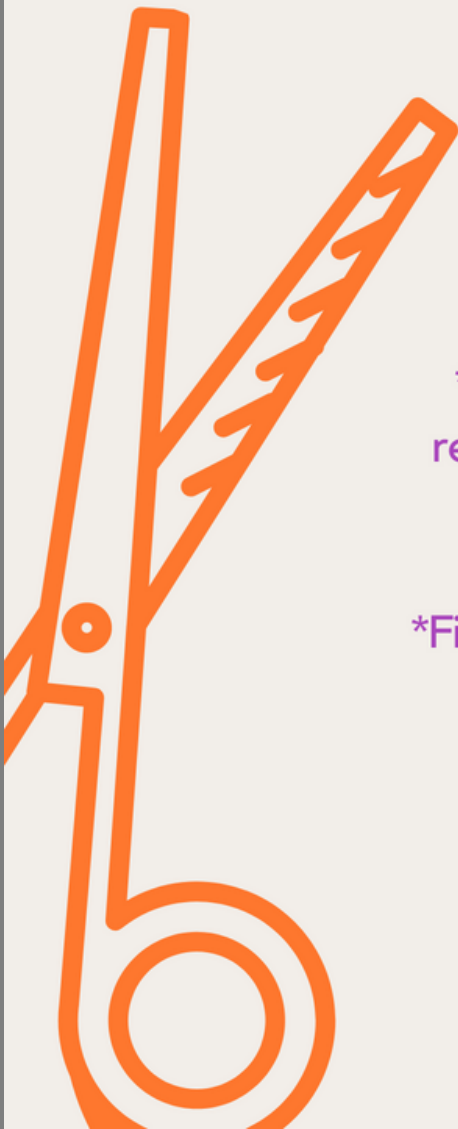

Dear Mt. Hood Quilt Guild Members,

I am writing on behalf of Quiltopia Oregon and our Quilt Show at the Mill that will be held this year on November 3 & 4 at Willamette Heritage Center in Salem, Oregon. Each year we display up to 200 quilts of all sizes in an art gallery-like setting on the third floor of the historic Thomas Kay Woolen Mill Building. Our show also includes a quilt challenge sponsored by The Grand Hotel and Good Vibes Quilt Company and is shown in the lobby at The Grand. We also have a number of vendors as well as a pre-show Saturday breakfast with this year's special guest artist, Erica Jackman of Kitchen Table Quilting.
